Appendix 1a: On-boarding programme_final

The follow-up plan related to the 2021 KIP and international evaluation is now final and the three themes - On-boarding, career planning and communication – will be implemented according to the timeline presented. The new on-boarding programme will be made available on the website and will be implemented no later than autumn 2022 to be ready for the new PhD students starting 1. September 2022. The on-boarding programme can also be used by all students already enrolled.

3. Briefing about the "Well-being funds for PhD students" by Niels Mejlgaard

The University Senior Management Team has decided to allocate University Management's Strategic Funds (USM) to activities enhancing well-being of PhD students.

<u>Appendix 2</u>: case presentation well-being funds

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The funds are allocated to initiatives that have a preventive effect on loneliness and dissatisfaction. The initiative focuses on the reception and integration of the PhD students and on the cultural and social support of the PhD process.

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USM has allocated DKK 160.000 to Aarhus BSS Graduate School, to be used as follows:

- in 2022, DKK 80,000
- in 2023, DKK 80,000

These funds can be used for initiatives presented by the PhD students, PhD supervisors and/or the PhD programmes. A template for suggestions for well-being activities will be provided by the Graduate School. The deadline for submission of applications for the 2022 funds is 31. August 2022. All suggestions should be submitted to rgb@au.dk. Allocation of funds will hereafter be decided by the Graduate School Head. Initiatives that go across PhD programmes and/or Graduate Schools will be prioritized.

The 2022 APV results falls in line with the 2021 KIP and international evaluation – a considerable amount of PhD student's experience issues with stress, loneliness, insecurities about own abilities to carry out a PhD project and to some extent inappropriate behavior and discrimination. These elements should be discussed during the local dialogue meetings at the departments.

5. Short briefing about the recent covid-19 situation by Niels Mejlgaard Requests for either extensions or exemptions regarding research environment change stays are continuously coming in and are still handled individually case by case. Currently, 44 applications for extension of enrolment and employment has been received; 2 are in process, 29 has been fully or partially granted and 12 has been rejected. This amounts to app. 73 months extension, in the range from 14 days to six months. A total of 93 dispensations for research environment change has been granted. (*Data per 16 May 2022, ref.*)
